

Bloom Projects: Ethan Turpin, Video Feedback: Pixel Behaviors

Santa Barbara-based artist, Ethan Turpin will create a dazzling projected installation of video feedback patterns, which resemble pantheistic design and microorganisms. Optically hypnotic, Turpin generates a system of pixel relationships derived from video's inherent geometry to transform the screen into a repeating vortex. This human-scale, real-time animation allows viewers to walk amongst it, evoking an uncanny feeling that life has emerged within the system.

Ethan Turpin received his BFA from Kansas City Art Institute, MO. He has been awarded the Visions For A New California Award (2010) and the William T. Colville Memorial Grant (2006).
